## **From the pastor** — Passing Christ's Love to Future Generations

I have been blessed to serve as your pastor for five years now, and I am looking forward to the years to come as a time when our mutual ministry can grow and flourish. Thank you for your support for Christ Church and the many ways that our church is stronger for the part you have played in the worship and spiritual life of this congregation.

Elsewhere in this newsletter you will see a four month calendar, highlighting some of the things that will be happening through the end of this year. Make sure you mark them down, and feel free to invite your friends and neighbors to participate in any or all of the coming events. You will see that there are many opportunities to gather with your friends and family through the life of Christ Church, so please participate as often as you can.

The world around us is changing dramatically, and the notion of "church" is quickly becoming unfamiliar to a new generation of people. Despite a large proportion of the population declaring themselves to be "believers," fewer and fewer people are participating actively in formal church settings of all backgrounds. Social networking keeps us in conversation with people all over the world instantly, but it rarely reflects the face to face interaction that has nourished people's souls for generations. There is a delicacy and intimacy to interpersonal communication that is missing from texts and twitters. Even skype conversations are carried on in separate screens, real time or not.

You probably participate actively in the church and other social organizations because you value the human contact and, for the church, the spiritual satisfaction you receive. This is too precious a gift to keep only to yourself and a small circle of friends and fam-

ily. Think back over your life and bring to mind some of the changing events and crises that were formative in your relationship with God, with your becoming the person that you are today. Some of those were certainly solitary occasions, but most were likely in personal contact with others. How we take our life experiences and use the knowledge we have gained from them is vital to how we look at church today.

If our intent is to preserve the church as a museum for the faith of our fathers and mothers, most likely the church will die with us when we pass on from this world. When we are able to see that church is a living monument to God's love for us, and we think about how we have been changed by that love, we begin to recognize that the church and its mission will be changed by that love as well. When we pass that love along to future generations by unreservedly welcoming the new ideas and challenges that transform the church into something meaningful for others as well, we begin to see how the church will continue to be important for many generations after we die.

This fall we will be seeking to make some alterations to our sanctuary and our worship structure that will prepare the church for future generations of worshippers, and will be costly, particularly to those who struggle to accept these changes. This transformation is necessary -- Jesus himself said "You cannot put new wine into old wineskins" -- and our openness to the possibilities that this generates for Christ Church will determine whether this is a strategy that enables growth to occur.



**Bethany Children's Home** provides residential services for children and adolescents who are unable to live with their own or a substitute family. Typically, these young people require more structure, more elaborate programming, and more highly-trained staff than is possible in a smaller group setting.


Founded in 1863 and related to the United Church of Christ, Bethany serves more than 300 boys and girls each year on its Womelsdorf, PA, campus. Additionally, through its Counseling Ministry, Bethany annually provides counseling services to over 600 families throughout the region. **American Indian Ministry Sunday** celebrates the historic United Church of Christ ministry with and among native communities. Funds collected will benefit CAIM, the UCC's Council for American Indian Ministry. 
