ANNUAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING
January 29, 2006

The Annual Congregational Meeting of Christ Church was called to order at 12:15 p.m. in the undercroft. Following a prayer by Interim Pastor David Serfass, President Howard Bixler expressed thanks to the kitchen crew who prepared the lunch.

Charlie Miller II made a motion and Ernie Heisey seconded to accept the minutes of the 2005 annual meeting. Motion carried.

Pastor's Report:

Pastor Dave said there was nothing to add to his written report. Tom Wolf made a motion and Shirley Wolfe seconded to accept the Pastor's Report. Motion carried.

Director of Music Report:

Kevin Biddle said there was nothing to add to his written report. He thanked the Bollinger family for their donation of the chimes this year.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Property: Ernie Heisey

Richard Fernsler made a motion and Joan Bernardo seconded to accept all the committee reports. Motion carried.

2006 Budget and Financial Reports

Betty Heisey noted that \$10,500 of undesignated memorial contributions went toward the building renovations. A \$5,000 gift from the Daniel Davis estate went toward new choir gowns.

Richard Fernsler made a motion and Louise Bixler seconded to accept the treasurer's report. Motion carried.

Howard Bixler thanked five consistory members who are retiring: Carl Graybill, Charlie Miller II, Nancy Blouch, Gale Reich and Darryl Loose.

Richard Fernsler presented a check for \$70 from the Annville-Cleona Lions Club, in memory of Myrtle Fasnacht.

Old Business:

Jerry Wolfe presented information and a photo of a cabinet to hold the Christ Church artifacts. The cabinet would cost about \$12,000 plus shipping from California. After discussion, Richard Fernsler made a motion and Louise Bixler seconded to appoint the Property Committee to spend no more than \$800 for an appraisal of the pieces. The committee will bring the information to consistory or a congregational meeting to vote on how to proceed. Motion carried.

Carl Graybill made a motion and Norman Bucher seconded to set a goal of \$300,000 for the Capital Campaign. Motion carried.

Tom Wolf presented an update on the sanctuary renovations expenses. To date we have been invoiced a total of \$242,039.62; and paid \$193,885.59, mostly from the endowment account. There are a few items outstanding, such as the south narthex handrail and some invoices that need to be corrected. The remaining balance will be paid after these are finalized.

PROPOSED BY-LAWS CHANGES

Howard Bixler opened the floor for discussion on the By-Laws changes as mailed to members in the Wake Tree. Elizabeth Kendall made a motion and Judy Feather seconded to accept the new By-Laws. Discussion.

Howard Bixler distributed a change to Article VII, noting the establishment of Consistory membership. Norman Bucher made a motion and Carl Graybill seconded to amend Elizabeth Kendall's motion to include these changes. Discussion.

Charlie Miller II made a motion to amend Norman Bucher's amendment that there should be no maximum number of members of any committee. Louise Bixler seconded.

By voice vote, Charlie Miller II's amendment and Norman Bucher's amendment were carried. By paper vote, 54 voted yes and 4 voted no to accept the new By-Laws.

Howard Bixler presented a slate of nominations for elders and deacons. The list was not included in the annual report due to the discussion and vote on new By-Laws. He presented the following recommendations:

2006 Annual Report Director of Music Ministry, Kevin L. Biddle

Sing unto God, ye kingdoms of the earth; O sing praises unto the Lord. Psalm 68:32

This has truly been an exciting year for Christ Church and the Music Ministry program with the addition of the new Youth Ringers and Singers, as well as our new pastor. Thanks to a generous donation from the Berry family, the Kuntz family, the Stein Bee Class and others in our church, we were able to purchase three octaves of hand bells. The Senior Ringers will be using these bells during our worship services, while the children will continue to play the tone chimes.

The Senior Choir sang at more than fifty services during the year. The Praise Team has also participated in a number of services providing us with new and exciting ways to sing God's praises. The Children's and Cherub choirs also sang at a number of worship services during the year. This fall six brave youth began attending Wednesday evening programs and singing/ringing! They have done a great job! Jodi Loose continues to do an exceptional job with the cherub choir and junior ringers. We have been averaging between 12 and 15 young ringers/singers this year! We will continue to look at ways to include vocal and instrumental music in our worship services for all ages.

The Senior Choir continued its tradition of presenting a program of gospel and spiritual music on Soup-er Soul Sunday. This year we were fortunate enough to have **Voices of Spirit**, the LVC Gospel Choir with us the first Sunday of February. We look forward to sharing more worship experiences with **VOS!** We collected a large amount of food and money for the Lebanon County Christian Ministries food bank.

During the summer months our choirs take a break and we are treated to a number of solos and duets from members of our congregation. Thank you to everyone who helped provide special music over the summer months.

As the senior choir returned to the loft we had a new member, Pastor Mason. It has been such a joy to have him be a part of our music ministry, as well as serving as our pastor. I really look forward to working with Pastor Mason for many years to come!

Early in November the LVC Chapel Choir joined us for worship. The young people shared their gift for song with our congregation and then enjoyed a luncheon prepared by the senior choir. The college students especially enjoyed the abundance of desserts that they were able to pack up and take back the dorms!

On Saturday, November 25, the senior choir continued their annual holiday tradition of making peanuts and cashews. More than 600 pounds of nuts were roasted and sold as part of the annual fundraiser.

In Advent all of the ensembles participated in our worship services sharing the story of Christ's coming in music. The Christmas Music Festival was presented on December 17, 2006. The senior choir presented the cantata, **Gather at the Manger**, narrated by Mary and Carl Graybill. We were also fortunate enough to have Jim Erdman and the Quartet Die/Posaunen perform. This year we tried something different for our Christmas Eve recital and the Praise Team and Senior Ringer provided the music. Thank you to all of the vocalists and musicians who were a part of the recital.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all of the members of the Christ Church choirs for their dedication and hard work during 2006. We are very fortunate to have such talented musicians and vocalists in our congregation. I appreciate each and every one of them. Thank you to the senior choir officers, President Edgar Fernsler, Jr., Weez Bixler, vice-president, Mandi Smith, treasurer and Debbie Smith, secretary. I would also like to thank Althea Hemperly and Janet Bucher for their help behind the scenes playing the piano for the Cherub Choir, fixing gowns, etc. JB Yorty has also been a welcome addition to our Music Ministry program serving as our substitute organist and I thank him. Thanks also goes to Pastor Mason and Pastor Bucher for their appreciation and support of the music program at Christ Church. Special thanks goes to Jodi Loose, our organist and my very good friend. I cannot imagine working with anyone else in this capacity. I would also like to thank Dolores Seibert for her friendship and support of our music program. Thanks, too, goes to our sexton Dale Good for all of his help. It is truly a blessing to serve Christ Church with this staff.

Property Committee

The Sanctuary renovations were completed. The church held a clean-up day in January. Members of the church, led by the Property Committee, did some much needed painting and cleaning of the church. The Committee and Pastor Don began reviewing the facility use form and the fees for using the church facilities.

The pewter pieces owned by the church were appraised. They are still on loan to the Historical Society. The Committee is still discussing where to keep the pieces.

The Capital Campaign began and the Property Committee was asked to develop a list of improvements needed at the church.

The Committee has started discussions of what to do with all of the items stored in the Bell Tower. No resolution to date.

Repairs to the stained glass windows on the second floor were made.

Ernie Heisey and Pastor Don met with the renters living in our rental properties. The Committee discussed the rental agreement and the amount being charged to each tenant for rent. The Committee agreed the rent should be raised by approximately 3 1/2 %.

The Committee has had ongoing conversations about keeping the church doors locked and who would be responsible when the church is not in use.

The Committee discussed the sound system and how to make it better for the hearing impaired. Recommendations were made to Consistory to purchase earbuds that the members and guests can use during the service.

Visitor parking has become a concern. It was suggested that members start parking in the elementary school lot across the street to allow room for visitors to park in the church lot.

On going repairs and general maintenance was completed throughout the year to keep the church operational.
