

'Old Annville Days' has a long history, first beginning as a community picnic known as the 'Union Sunday-School Picnic'. These were held in the Hill Church Grove, most people reaching the site on foot going north behind what is now the Giant in Cleona. Later picnics in the early 1900's were held at Penryn Park south of Cornwall traveling by rail on trains changing in Lebanon to the Cornwall-Mt Hope Line. Later years the picnics were held at the Carsonia Park near Reading. Both of these parks have passed out of existence.

The most memorable picnics from the 1930's to early 1970's were held at Hershey Park. Picnic baskets could be left at the 2 fire halls in town and taken to Hershey by truck. Many people traveled by trolley or train early to get a 'good table' at one of the pavilions in the park. There were many contests held in the hallnark prizes were donated by merchants & industries in town many of

which closed for the day. Afternoons were spent watching a ball game between the 2 local teams, swimming in the Hershey Pool, or using the free ride tickets provided by the Sunday Schools in town. This was all before the admission charge to the park as it is today, most of these areas were located near the present main entrance to the park.

The biggest event of the day was the program in the band shell, featuring local soloists, the Annville Brotherhood Chorus, and Lem Carmany's band ending with the Stars & Stripes Forever.




