
## Join US by PHONE on SUNDAY MORNINGS!



## The Plan for Returning to In-Person Worship When it Is Safe to Do So Again

Please consider the following guidelines for attending worship when it is safe to be in person again:

Out of an abundance of love and respect for each other, we are asking those who wish to attend our worship service in person, to review these friendly reminders. If we want to continue in-person worship, please help us follow these guidelines:

- 1. Please try to arrive, and only come into the church building 10-15 minutes before the worship service begins. Guidelines recommend only being in a gathering space for approximately 45 minutes.
- 2. Please continue to wear your mask as you get out of your car, and until you return to your car after the service.

- 3. Please continue to use hand sanitizer when going in and out of the building, after pressing the buttons on the elevator, etc.
- 4. Please stay six feet apart, even when wearing a mask. This would include trying to remain six feet apart from anyone that you might have a conversation with in the church.
- 5. Please try to sit six, or more feet apart from someone who is not a member of your household, or inner circle.
- 6. Please avoid gathering before and after the service to talk and socialize.

We know that these guidelines are difficult, because we want to fellowship together. Unfortunately, for the immediate future we need to follow these simple guidelines to keep everyone safe.

## "Diggings & Dustings" By our church historian – Steve Miller

Last month gave a brief history of the Jerusalem Cemetery, the site of which is the lawn area behind Christ Church. The following are biographies of some of the notable early Annville residents interred there.

- 1) Anamaria Fischer Stroh (4/02/1740-4/03/1804) The first burial, married to Johannes. They lived at 55 W Main St in a log home, the land purchased from Adam Ulrich in 1772, one of the early founders of Annville.
- 2) Martin Ulrich (8/1749-4/02/1825) Donated the land on which Jerusalem Church was built, predecessor to Christ Church. He was the son of Adam Ulrich I, who was one of the 3 founders of Annville in 1762, the founders of Annville were: Miller, Raiguel, Ulrich.
- 3) Henry Berry (d 09/19/1826) He was the "Baumeister" or master-builder of the Jerusalem church erected in 1804. This was when architect, contractor, and builder were one; he was said to be a skillful mechanic and was the one responsible for the building of the original Jerusalem Church.
- 4) Johannes Schmidt (02/1750-3/19/1818) A soldier of the American Revolution, was with Washington in the battles of Long Island, Trenton, Princeton, Brandywine, and Germantown.
- 5) John Philip Marshall (1/04/1834-7/21/1850) He drowned in the Quittapahilla at the "Black Oak" while bathing with some companions, he was seized with cramp. His father John G. and grandfather David were both prominent physicians in Annville, and preceded him in death. All 3 generations are buried here.
- 6) Frederick Galebach (3/21/1811-3/12/1891) The last burial in the cemetery, he was a saddler by trade, and at the same time proprietor of the Black Horse Hotel.

We have records of many others buried here: linen weavers, dyers, chairmakers, teachers, butchers, felt hatters, bakers, tinsmiths. There are 45 children less than 1 year old and 69 children aged 1-6 years old (there is no separate area for children). The records and the last known photograph of the cemetery before the stones were removed and the monument erected in 1954 is on display in the library on the 2nd floor. Next

month will start a series on the 'stained glass ministry' of Christ Church when the question will be answered why there was once a window behind the reredos and its present location.





#### MARCH BELL CHOIR REHEARSALS


